SUMMER OF MISSIONS BEGINS: *About the opportunities to contribute and the organizations supported*

June kicks off the Summer of Missions at Nall! Below are the organizations we will be supporting, a little bit about them and how you can join in the local missions outreach efforts.

City Union Mission

City Union Mission is an evangelical Christian ministry committed to sharing the Gospel and meeting the spiritual, physical, and emotional needs of men, women, and children who are poor or homeless. Since 1924, City Union Mission has provided warm beds, nutritious food and a place of safety for thousands of poverty-stricken and homeless men, women, and children.



The mission receives no government support and is not a United Way agency. It depends completely on the gifts of God's people.

We will have several ways to come alongside the work the mission is doing:

Thrift store assistance: help sort donations at the City Union Thrift store on Shawnee Mission Parkway. June 4 and 11, 9:30 am to 12:30 PM. Must be at least 16 years old.

Yardwork and varied light manual labor: Includes yard work, painting and/or other activities. Meet at the City Union Mission offices in downtown Kansas City, Mo. Must be at least 12 years old.

Serve lunch at City Union Mission Family Life Center in downtown Kansas City, Mo., 11:00 am to 1:00 PM. Children welcome if accompanied by an adult.

Serve a meal at your choice of time: Gather a group to serve with and pick a time to serve a meal at City Union Mission Family Life Center on any date and time in June. 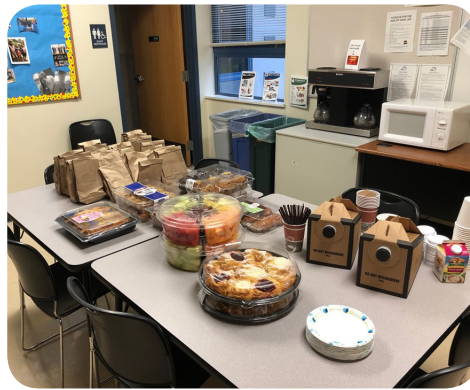


Backpack Delivery: Take filled backpacks to Mission Adelante for staff to distribute to children. Date and time TBD.
