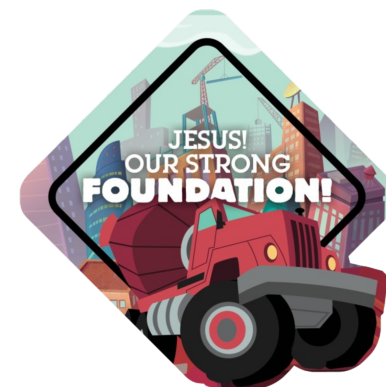

LIFE HAPPENS.

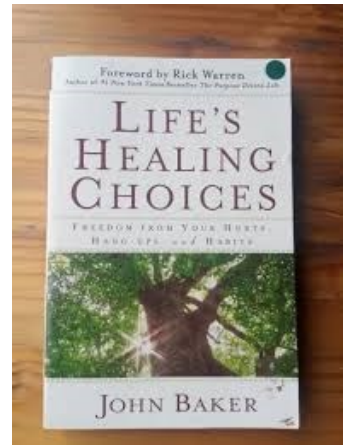
Happiness and Healing are yours for the choosing.

Student Ministry News and Updates by Lewis Jones



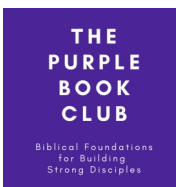
Welcome to all of our new 7th grade students and families!

What It Takes to Have On-Site and Live Streamed Worship Services

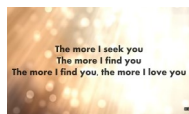

We are all excited for on-site services again. However, we all need to realize that things are not going to immediately go back to the way they were. There are going to be different social standards, but what I would like to address are the changes with our tech setup.

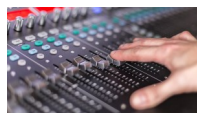
At the beginning of this year discussions were starting regarding videoing our services with the possibility of live streaming them. Little did we know that come March those ideas would be initiated and would forever change our Sunday morning ministry. Whether you know it or not, it takes a lot of work not only to produce an on-site service on Sunday mornings but also to communicate that service through a live stream. When the need arose a handful of volunteers stepped forward, but there is still a need to train others to help in the following roles:



Online Service Producer – This person leads the online congregation in the best possible virtual worship experience by most accurately conveying the events of our live service. They work with encoding software to switch between views (camera, slides, and videos) to create a video stream to send to our YouTube channel. If you have found yourself watching a lot of online videos during this quarantine, you might be the type that knows what makes a good online video.



Lyric/Slide Presenter – This person leads the congregation in worship by creating and/or displaying the projected visuals with excellence; capturing and directing attention without distraction. They make sure that the slides (sermons, songs, scripture, and videos) are visible and appear at the right times. People who get bothered by things ‘not looking quite right’ will find that they can apply that ‘attention to detail’ in this position.



Sound Engineer – This person leads in worship by capturing, mixing, and producing the services audio with excellence; actively pursuing a sound that facilitates the corporate worship service. They make sure that things are sounding good in the auditorium, foyer, and online. If you have ever found yourself messing with the eq settings in your car stereo, then you might find that you would like to serve in this capacity.

Now, I know what you’re thinking... Mark, I do not know one thing about this position. Let me assure you that you would have myself and other tech people willing to help you understand what you are doing so that you can become great in these positions. Typically, anyone interested gets the opportunity to shadow the position before ‘sitting in the chair.’ Some nerves and anxiety are natural. So, don’t let that get in your way of experiencing the joy of serving our church (both online and on-site) in one of these roles.

When are we going to Worship On-Site again?

Many of you have been asking when we will worship in person again? Pastor Joe announced in his most recent video that based on a survey sent out, we will have only 2 services, 9 am and 10:45. In the past few weeks, recommendations from Officials on phase reopenings and specific numbers and capacity have changed and lack clarity, so the staff has decided to limit to 75 people, and continue to evaluate during the summer. We have already taken out every other row of seating in the Sanctuary so we can practice safe distancing. We are providing a cushion between those services to allow exiting safely and allowing time for volunteers to clean before the second service. The Church Staff and Volunteers will be required to wear a mask. The first service will be specifically geared toward higher risk individuals or those who want added protection, so we are asking everyone to be extra vigilant in protecting others by wearing a mask. We are still encouraging social distancing and wearing a mask, but not making it mandatory in the 10:45 service. We have consulted with other churches and leaders and they are encouraging social distancing and wearing mask but not making it mandatory. So this is the approach we have decided to take as we reopen. Please note, for all of you and especially for those of you who feel they still want to say home, we understand and want to encourage you to make the best decision for yourself and others, we will continue to live-stream the 10:45 service. During the summer time, Core Groups will not be meeting on Sunday mornings but encouraged to schedule other times they can meet when they are ready. They can do that through the office, the building is open just call the office to schedule. Thank you to everybody for your understanding and flexibility over the past several weeks. Also as we move forward, it’s a unique time and we want to continue to evaluate how we can best move forward as a church together.
