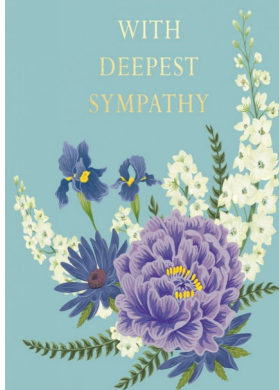
Church Picnic

Value Them Both by Pastor Bob Mills

We have the opportunity to vote this month on the Value Them Both amendment. The amendment is a biblical and moral issue and not political. For me it is a vote for life. I am in favor of the life and wellbeing of the child and the mother.

I am so grateful to David and Heidi Langford for their leadership in informing all of us as to what is at stake with the outcome of the Value Them Both vote.

Key points to remember (David Langford).

1. In 2019, our Kansas Supreme Court said our 1859 Kansas State Constitution contains a fundamental right to abortion. The fight for the value of all life (women and babies) was put front and center for all Kansans.
2. As a result, existing laws on abortions that have been passed on a bi-partisan basis over the years can be struck down one by one. The dismemberment ban has already been deemed unconstitutional (which will allow late-term abortion).
3. Value Them Both will not result in a ban on abortion but continue to maintain the current laws in place.
4. If it does not pass, it has been said that Kansas could become the abortion capitol of the Midwest.
5. Keep in mind, every human life is precious to the heart of God because every person has been made in His image.
6. In the Kansas-Nebraska Convention of Southern Baptists annual meeting last year, a resolution passed unanimously expressing the desire to support the Value Them Both amendment. Because of this, I believe we should stand with our fellow Southern Baptists across Kansas in support of the amendment.

In Psalm 139:16 it states... "You saw me before I was born. Every day of my life was recorded in your book. Every moment was laid out before a single day had passed."

As your interim pastor, I encourage you to vote as the Spirit leads you, but please vote.
