

The Nativity of Jesus by Pastor Bob Mills



Is there a birth narrative in the Gospel of John? Generally, we do not turn to the fourth gospel to discuss the birth narrative of Jesus. That is unfortunate, because I think there is a nativity without the remembrance of an animal stable, simple shepherds and wise men.

When John sits down to write his account of Jesus' birth, he replays all the events of the birth in his mind—which Mary has no doubt recounted to him again and again—and he goes straight to the heart of the matter. He begins by telling us about the one he calls the Word and his coming into this dark world. As he writes, two words seem to dominate his thinking throughout the Gospel of John: Light and Life. These two attributes reminded John of Jesus.

"In Him was life", John wrote. Jesus was not merely alive, though He was...Mary remembers the sound of His cry. But more than that, Life was in Him. Life that was more than breathing and a heartbeat; it was whatever it is that breathing and beating hearts are a result of. Life, the very thing itself, was in Him. He was life come alive. It was in Him, so it was His to give. In fact, that is exactly why He came.

"That Life was the Light of Men", John writes. John reflects for a moment and begins to remember incident after incident of how Jesus was the light that gave life to countless numbers of people living in dark places. Life that is alive is light.

I believe there is a birth narrative in the first chapter of John's Gospel. Specifically, it is John 1:5, "The LIGHT in the darkness shone, and the darkness did not understand it." This is John's nativity. Perhaps it should be read before one reads Matthew and Luke because it prepares us to hear them more clearly. The Light that is Jesus shines into, around, and above the darkness in the stable, the darkness of the world, and the deep darkness of our own hearts. The Bible says the light is not understood, not by the shepherds or the wise men, or by you and me.

My prayer this Christmas, is for the Life (Jesus), to come to life in us.
