



Our Volunteer Spotlight for May is Anelda Clancy! Thank you, Anelda, and all of our volunteers who serve for all you do for Nall Avenue Baptist Church!

Tell us something about yourself!

I was born in South Africa and lived there all my life. I have four brothers and a sister. Both my parents are still alive by God's grace. What areas do you serve in?

MOPS Children's Ministry, TeamKID teaching 1st and 2nd grade, extended care and Core Group on Sundays.

Why do you serve?

not only for what they will become in the future but for who they are today. With our schools no longer teaching about God, I am passionate to teach them about the one and only true God that is alive. God is the only author who is in love with His readers. What is an unexpected blessing you have experienced because you serve?

What would you say to someone who is thinking about serving in one of Nall's ministries?

By serving we get a front row seat to watching God transform students' lives. In the best of times, you'll get to see entire families change—if only you watch closely enough. Sanctification Forever Moving Forward by Pastor Bob Mills



Always moving forward in our Christian life is the goal. Once we have been saved (justified), it becomes necessary for us to move forward in our Christian walk to become more like Christ. That process of moving forward is called sanctification.

The Australian coat of arms (pictured above) pictures two creatures, the emu, a flightless bird, and the kangaroo. The animals were chosen because they share a characteristic that appealed to the Australian citizen. Both the emu and the kangaroo can move only forward, not back. The emu's three-toed foot causes it to fall if it tries to go backward, and the kangaroo is prevented from moving in reverse by its large tail.

Those who truly choose to follow Jesus become like the emu and the kangaroo, moving only forward, never back. Luke 9:62 says, Jesus replied "No one who puts his hand to the plow and looks back is fit for service in the Kingdom of God".
